# RENEW ONLINE !! PAY BY OCTOBER 31st!!





#### MEMBERSHIP INFORMATON

- Automated dues renewal notices are currently being sent to members with an email address on a 60-,30and 7-day schedule for the October 31st deadline.
- After October 31st, the "You have been bumped" notices will automatically be sent to those who have not renewed and they will no longer receive correspondence from us.
  - You can RENEW online with a credit card at www.deltaclippedwings.org (no AMEX).
    - > Click on "RENEW MEMBERSHIP" in the QUICK LINKS section.
    - Unless you changed your USERNAME, use your email address to sign-in.
    - > If you have forgotten your PASSWORD, click on "forgot password" to reset.
- Make changes to your profile before you submit your payment, e.g., home address, email address, etc..
- You will receive an email confirmation showing your dues payment and your new membership expiration date. Print for your records.

#### EXPIRATION DATE CLARIFICATION

Because of the date-based system we use for the dues reminders, NEW members who join(ed) BEFORE October 31<sup>st</sup> will have a 2016 expiration date on their email confirmation; however, we correct that for them to 2017 or beyond if they joined for multiple years.

Members renewing for 2016-17 should see 2017 as their new expiration date on the comfirmation email.

MEMBERSHIP FORM: You can print/mail the form attached to this newsletter or print one from our website. You don't have to log in to our website to print the form. It is located on the HOME page in the navigation pane at the top under MEMBERSHIP FORM.

SOMETHING NEW ON THE MEMBERSHIP FORM: You can now choose whether you want to receive a RED BOOK Directory. Some of our members like to use the online directory, so they don't need a hard copy.

CARRYOVER DUES: If you joined/renewed after May 1, 2016, your dues have been applied to the 2016-17 membership year and your dues expiration date has been changed accordingly in your profile. You will not receive an automated dues renewal reminder for this membership year.

**EMPLOYEE NUMBER:** For **NEW** member online applications, we require an employee number so Delta HR can verify IFS employment. This is to protect our member information since the public has access to part of our website. NEW members will be "activated" once we hear back from HR.

# "PAY AT THE DOOR" RESERVATIONS

After each luncheon, I enter the "pay at the door" checks/cash into the accounting system on our website which generates a confirmation email to the attendee for that event, if they have an email address. Since event registration for the next luncheon can "overlap" these late accounting entries, please double check the event dates when you receive an email confirmation so you are not confused about which event you have paid for.

\*\* BINGO is being replaced with the game L C R (Left, Center, Right). It is a dice game that can be enjoyed by tables of 8. It is a VERY EASY game to master and it allows everyone at the table to continue to visit and talk throughout the entire game.

**EACH PERSON PLAYING** needs to bring at least three \$1 bills to put in the center pot of the table. When the game is over, the winner takes the center pot of money. The winner may donate the entire winnings to LDF or a portion or keep it.

There should be plenty of time to play more than one game per table as every table is an independent game; therefore, members should bring plenty of \$1 bills for each \$3 game.

NOTE: If some members need to leave after any of the games are completed, but more games are getting started, not to worry, any number of players may play so everyone is flexible to come and go as they please.



HOW TO PLAY

- ❖ Each player puts \$3 in center pot.
- ❖ Begin with three L C R cubes and three chips for each player. After determining which player starts the game, the first player rolls the three cubes.
- The number of Ls indicates the number of chips to be passed to the player on the left.
- The number of Rs indicates the number of chips to be passed to the player on your right.
- The number of Cs indicates the number of chips to be placed in the center pot.
- The DOTS are neutral and players neither pass nor place chips in the pot for any DOTS rolled.
- When a player has only 1 or 2 chips, they roll only 1 or 2 cubes. If a player has no chips, he is still in the game, but passes the cubes to the next player. The last player with chips is the winner, does not roll the cubes, and wins the center pot.



#### A PAVILION AND A FAMILY WORTH VISITING: THE BARBEES OF ISLE OF HOPE

The old Isle of Hope streetcar still rocked along its tracks in the early 1940s when vigilant Sisters of Mercy just barely managed to keep their charges seated inside the open-air vehicle. The children and their teachers were headed for an annual picnic, the last gasp of the school year, at Camp Villa Marie. Near their destination was Barbee's Pavilion, located on the banks of the Skidaway River, where terrapins - doomed to be future dinner delicacies - were on view for prospective buyers. Given the early ties of the Barbee family with the Cathedral, the children's yearly visit to the area seems quite appropriate.

Barbee family members were communicants of Saint John the Baptist Church, Savannah, before it became a Cathedral.



Natives of Saint Augustine, Florida, the Barbees were probably Minorcans, "a group from which so many of Savannah's first Hispanic families were drawn." (AUTOCRACY OF THE HEART: CATHOLIC LAY LEADERSHIP IN SAVANNAH, by Thomas Paul Thigpen). The earliest Saint John's sacramental record of Barbees is the marriage of Francisco Barbee to Magdalena Hernandez on May 5, 1818. Baptisms of this couple's descendants and other Barbee relatives followed.



DELTA EMPLOYEES TO BUILD EIGHT HABITAT FOR HUMANITY HOMES IN SIX U.S. CITIES

Delta employees from across the country will build or renovate affordable, single-family homes in partnership with Habitat for Humanity International this fall.

The annual builds will take place in six cities, including Delta's hubs in Atlanta, Detroit, Minneapolis-St. Paul, New York City, Seattle and Los Angeles. More than 2,400 Delta employees will participate in the projects, which began September 7 and will continue through November 17.



"Delta is invested in giving back and making a difference in the state of the state



Affairs. "I am proud of our employees for donating their valued time and talents to help build homes in partnership with families from coast to coast."

Projects include an all-Habitat development for military veterans and their families in Seattle; a home in Atlanta funded through TechOps' oil recycling initiative and two additional homes built side-by-side in Atlanta's Westside; and a home in Minneapolis-St. Paul funded by Delta's on-board recycling program. Additionally, Delta employees will help rehab a home in Queens, New York, and build a home in Los Angeles. The Los Angeles project will mark Delta's first build inside the city limits.

Delta employees have helped build or rehab 227 Habitat homes in 12 countries around the world. The domestic builds will mark homes 228-235 for Delta. Habitat is one of Delta's core community partners as it acknowledges the need for safe, decent and affordable shelter around the globe.

Earlier this year, Delta announced it will contribute 1 percent of its net income from the previous year to key charitable organizations, including Habitat for Humanity. This commitment will be fulfilled through cash contributions and in-kind travel, as well as grants from The Delta Air Lines Foundation. In 2016, Delta is projected to give \$37 million to charitable organizations worldwide.
