It's that time of year again to thank our military and their families by volunteering for Delta Air Lines' Military Lounge. Signing up this year is different than in years past ... it is now done online at

DATES: November 28th ~ January 2nd from 0600-2100 daily

Two volunteers per shift | Shifts are in three hour increments.

Shift times are posted on the above-mentioned link.

LOCATION: California Room on B Concourse



DAY OF YOUR SHIFT: Once you have parked you will need to get your gate pass that will allow you access through the SECURITY CHECK POINT. All volunteers need to check-in at BANK 4 at Delta's main level ticket counter. The monitor above the position will be labeled GATE PASS CHECK-IN. Be sure to tell the Agent you are volunteering in the military lounge and need to pick up a gate pass. You will need to show a photo ID to get your pass and once again

when you go through the check point. The Agents in the lobby have been briefed on these procedures; hopefully you won't have any problems, but if you do, please look for a Passenger Service Agent in their red coat.

PHOTO ID: The name you use to sign-up must match the ID you are going to show to get through Security. Children without a photo ID may be escorted through with an adult.

FOOD: The lounge welcomes ANY and ALL food, especially homemade fresh food! You may take your food directly to the lounge provided it will be allowed through security. If not, DELTA DASH is located right before you enter the lower level curbside area. Please note, all food items must be wrapped, dated and marked with the donor's information, i.e., name and address.

TOYS: Only small toys that will fit under the tree.

**PARKING:** Retirees may ride the employee bus from the GO parking lot to the terminal and **MUST HAVE** their retiree badge with them. As of this printing Delta has not received confirmation from the city for parking passes this year, but check at the end of your shift to see if they are available.

Thank you in advance for helping to honor our Military during this holiday season. They have waited a long time to come home to their loved ones and this opportunity allows us to thank them for their sacrifices. Our time and donations may seem small, but if you can put a smile on one of their faces, that is huge!

#### Sculpture on Duluth Town Green to Reinvent 9/11-Inspired Painting

Congratulations to Kathy Fincher on her achievements as an artist.

About a week ago on the Duluth Town Green, Kathy Fincher held a dozen or so residents spellbound as she recounted how she created THE DREAM KEEPERS, a limited-edition lithograph sold across the country.

It was a heady moment for the Duluth artist. Not only had THE DREAM KEEPERS hung in our nation's Oval Office, it had finally come full circle to the city that birthed Fincher's creativity and was poised to become the largest public work of children in the country in a city that had been dubbed one of America's most patriotic.

"This project is sure to become a destination public art piece for our community," Mayor Nancy Harris told the crowd gathered at the November 7 groundbreaking ceremony for the project.

It almost didn't happen. In those god-awful days following the 9/11 terrorist attack, every bit of creativity Kathy Fincher owned got up

and left. The Duluth artist had been at the top of her game, but now all she could do was sit and stare. Sit and stare. "I felt numb," she said.

Fincher, though, had seen one child after another draw pictures depicting the pain and confusion that so many of us felt and it hit her. As an artist, it was her responsibility to share with us a message of hope.

For three days after 9/11, Fincher sat in her studio and stared at a blank 30-by 40-inch canvas, trying desperately to digest why we'd been attacked. What was it about America that made her so offensive?

She drew a rectangle on the canvas and then a cross intersecting it. Faith and freedom, she whispered to herself, and wondered how to manifest those core values, the things that make America America, into a piece of art.

Since her childhood, art had played a major role in Fincher's life. Her mother, Margaret Parsons Andrews, studied art in college and would later become the visionary for the arts in Gwinnett County, helping orchestrate, design and raise funds for Hudgens Center for the Arts.

Fincher was in 10<sup>th</sup> grade when she began studying classical drawing under Gainesville artist Lydia Banks McCrary and later impressionistic pastels with Phillip Lekki.

Painting soon faded into the shadows as she turned to water and snow skiing and then life as a Delta Air Lines flight attendant. As she crisscrossed the world, Fincher used layovers to expand her art knowledge, visiting museums and art galleries. In her spare time, she painted.

It wasn't until 1990, when she painted a portrait of her daughter Maggie, that the faces of children figured in her art. The painting got the attention of Current Inc., and the calendar publisher wanted more.

Fincher was cool to the idea, but as she painted the first child's face for the month of December, she fell in love.

"A slight shadow around the mouth changed the entire expression," she said. "I was hooked."

Fincher's career exploded as more companies commissioned her to paint children's images for everything from cards and books, to prints and tapestries.

But it gets even better. In 2003, Fincher signed with DEMDACO to create a line of detailed figurines based on her paintings. Mama says became a registered trademark, making Fincher the most licensed children's artist in America.

"It seemed reasonable to me that I could do the same thing life-sized: create bronzes of children for public and private artwork," she said.

Her first piece - commissioned by Judge Emily Brantley - was an 8-foot bronze dancing angel called BELIEVE permanently displayed in the lobby of the Gwinnett Medical Center.

Today Fincher has created 12 bronzes of horses and children and painted more than 150 children's images on thousands of products.

She hadn't counted on THE DREAM KEEPERS becoming a permanent sculpture, but it made sense.

Six weeks after 9/11 and not sure what to do, Fincher remembered another painting she'd done with children from her church.

What if she had children dip their hands in red, white and blue and put America back together.

She realized a row of children would be boring, so she drew a ladder with one bending over to touch the top of the flag. She drew a banner bearing God Bless America and a child sitting on the lower rung of the ladder. Then she drew another child and another until there were seven representing the seven continents, all of them busy at work.



Fincher would continue working on the piece for another six weeks, night and day, adding light, a side window and a cross. When she was done, she loaded it into the back of her van and headed to downtown Duluth. She needed her mother's and aunt's approval.

It was a bystander who did the honors. Looking on, he took his finger and outlined a large red handprint at the foot of the cross that neither Fincher nor her mother had noticed.

In that moment, seeing the perfectly drawn handprint, she knew The Dream Keepers was complete.

The painting would eventually end up in our nation's capital, a gift to former first lady Laura Bush.

Now, all these years later, a bronze rendering by Fincher and renowned sculptor Martin Dawe, of CherryLion Studios,

will become a gift to all of us, most notably the city of Duluth, named by Rand McNally one of the five most patriotic cities in America. Dawe was tapped earlier this year to create a statue of slain civil rights leader the Rev. Martin Luther King Jr.

As one of the largest figurative public works of children in the country, it features eight lifelike bronze children, a 5-by-7-foot hand painting of the American flag on glass and a columned backdrop brick wall that spans 9 feet by 12 feet. Fincher said designing the 3-D sculpture for the city she grew up in is in many ways her crowning moment.

"It's been instilled in me to leave a legacy," she said. "Duluth is a role model city for patriotism and a community that embodies the very spirit and values of THE DREAM KEEPERS. I felt it needed to be here."

An unveiling of the completed project will be announced early next year.

FEE-WAIVED ADOPTIONS FOR VETERANS

The Atlanta Humane Society has long recognized the value of pet ownership for veterans. In early 2014, AHS co-founded the Pets for Vets program with the Buckhead Rotary Club, and to date this effort has provided more than 300 fee-waived pet adoptions for veterans.



According to a recent report by the Department of Veterans Affairs, 22 veterans take their own lives every day in the United States. A new study by Purdue University shows that service dogs can reduce PTSD symptoms by up to 82% in just one week, proving that the power of a pet can help our heroes heal.

One veteran who has benefited from the Pets for Vets program is Rodney Pinkney-Talbert and his wife, JT. Rodney,

who served in the Navy as a rank E3 Seaman, adopted Sparky through the Pets for Vets program in 2015.

"We walked into the area where the adult dogs were and began to hear that familiar howling we once heard in our home when we had a beloved Husky," says JT. "We began abruptly scanning the kennels to see where it was coming from and BOOM there he was - Sparky! When he saw us, he began jumping and howling in his hound-like said, 'That's him!' We made sure he would be a good fit with Harley, an American Dingo we have had for 12 years. Just as we hoped, both dogs ended up getting along



just fine. Sparky even welcomed us with a few jumps, barks and kisses! "Sparky has added so much life to our family from the day we got him! Every day it's something to look forward to with him - either a new howling tone, facial expression, or game. His personality is high energy (like his master's) and always happy. He loves interacting with visitors and other dogs as well. We love playing with him in the backyard and hide and seek with him in the house. Sparky is a fun dog and lifts our spirits if we are feeling down."


