The Atlanta Humane Society's Pets for Vets program is very happy to report that between November 1, 2016 and February 1, 2017, we have had nearly 100 animals adopted into loving veteran homes. This puts the number of adoptions, since the program's inception in April of 2014, at nearly 400.



One adopter recently shared her experience:

... I was looking for images of gray cats while researching Chartreux cats and came across Pixie's photograph. I honestly thought she looked so pathetic (one eye, bobbed tail, scruffy coat) that I decided I had to get her because no one else would, poor baby. So, that led me to your website. I was looking for the "how to adopt" information and stumbled on the Pets for Vets benefit and came into the shelter the next day. I would have adopted her at full price in any case, but it was really nice that there was a benefit for veterans.

So anyway, this was a very positive experience for me. As a veteran, I can

tell you there aren't very many benefits or expressions of appreciation from the civilian world and it just made my day! I have always adopted my pets from shelters/rescue groups, but haven't seen any programs like yours before. I was specifically impressed to see you are also involved with providing therapy dogs for Marines who qualify. That's a program that provides such an important support for veterans in need. Keep up the great work.

The North Georgia Camellia Society flower show at the Atlanta Botanical Gardens on February 18/19 was a big success. We had 800 blooms entered by competitors from South Carolina, Georgia and Florida. The trio of large flowers (pictured) are "Frank Houser" camellias which were successfully grown outside (Unprotected) in the Columbus, GA area. This size camellia is called a Reticulata which does not do well in the Atlanta climate unless grown in a greenhouse (Protected). Protected and



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unprotected blooms are judged independently as is the separate category of Metro Atlanta (Unprotected).

Visitors to the ABG are in awe when they see the array of blooms in Day Hall. Most of what have been blooming outside in the Atlanta area during January and February are of the Japonica variety and have been fabulous this winter.

BREAKING BARRIERS: BLACK PIONEER PILOTS SHARE TRIUMPHS By Shannon Ledwich • posted February 1, 2017



At a time of racial and gender discrimination, Bessie Coleman became the first black woman to earn a pilot's license in the 1920s. The Tuskegee Airmen became America's first black military squadron during World War II. After a six-year legal battle, Marlon Green became the first black commercial airline pilot in 1963.



At Delta, two other black pioneers are among those who have secured places in aviation and American history: Cal Flanigan and Rachelle Kerr. Each started their career at very different times, and neither took the traditional route to achieve their dream of becoming a pilot.

Flanigan began working in maintenance at Delta in 1968, four years after the Civil Rights Act became law and black pilots began breaking through the color barrier. "I was always a believer that ability does not come with skin color, whether you're a male or female, no matter your background or religion," Flanigan said recently. "If you have the ability, the drive and the desire, nothing else matters." That same year, Delta hired its first black pilot, Sam Graddy. He was an inspiration to Flanigan, who followed in his footsteps, becoming a Delta pilot himself in 1976. Years later, their careers would intersect in a history-making moment for the airline.

Pilots like Graddy and Flanigan helped pave the way for Kerr, who faced her own stereotypes on her journey from the tarmac to the cockpit. She started her career at Delta in 1994 as a ramp agent but her true calling was not on the ground but in the air. "It was a male-dominated industry. I wasn't sure how I'd be treated or looked at, but I didn't care," said Kerr. "I decided I was going to go for it and just kept looking forward."

With the encouragement of a pilot friend, she took an introductory flight lesson in a Cessna 172. From the moment she sat in the cockpit, she was hooked. Kerr's career came full circle in 2010 when she returned to Delta as a first officer.

Flanigan's fascination with flight was sparked at a young age. That passion carried him into the history books in 1980, when he and Graddy became the first black cockpit crew to fly together at Delta. Fittingly, their flight plan took them through the heart of the American South - from Alabama to Mississippi - where the civil rights movement had encountered some of its stiffest resistance. Flanigan flew into history once more when he retired in 2013 as Delta's longest-serving captain.

Kerr made history of her own in 2009 while she was a captain at Atlantic Southeast Airlines, a Delta Connection carrier. There, she piloted the first all-black, all-female flight crew in U.S. history, which included first officer Stephanie Grant and flight attendants Robin Rogers and Diana Galloway. Making the moment even more special, it happened in February: Black History Month.

Today, Flanigan and Kerr hope their stories inspire others. "You can be anything you want to be, but you have to be willing to work and to sacrifice," said Flanigan. Kerr believes it's important to lead by example, showing young women

that a career in aviation can be a reality. "Don't let anyone stop you from achieving that dream," she said. "Just remember to keep looking up."

- 1. You CANNOT substitute someone else's name for your name in the "member section" on ANY of our forms.
- 2. For example, if you want to enter an auction item for a friend on our ITEM DONATION FORM, you MUST log in using **THEIR username and password**, **NOT yours**.
- 3. The reason for this is upon login on ANY of our forms, your information "AUTO-POPULATES" the member information. It is generated from our member database.
- 4. Substituting your name/address/email with someone else's will change your personal profile.
- 5. You will have "edited" your own profile as if you had a new name, email address, phone number or address change.
- 6. If you changed the email entry, you will not receive emails from us at your "real" email address.

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- 7. In addition, the item you are listing will not be credited to the right person in our accounting system.
- 8. Once we "fix" your profile, all the transactions you made under your original login will remain under your name, NOT your friend's.
