Norma Mary Webb

November 23, 1919 - May 11, 2018 | FA Class 07/10/1946

As many of you know, Norma was somewhat of a legend ... She was with Delta from July 1946 to July 2002 ... **56 years!!!!** In May of 1998 PEOPLE magazine featured Norma in the following article ... I thought you might be interested in it:

FLYING HIGH

As Delta Flight 32 climbs out of Atlanta en route to Munich, gray-haired Norma Webb pops open a bottle of champagne and, despite some turbulence, pours it without spilling a drop. The spry 78-year-old flight attendant walks up and down the aisle offering plastic glasses of bubbly to coach passengers. Nine hours later, after pushing meal carts, picking up trays and answering call buttons nonstop, Webb, still smiling, begins folding blankets as dawn breaks over Germany.

Delta Air Lines' oldest flight attendant shows no signs of preparing her 52-year career for a landing. And with no mandatory retirement age, the airline isn't pressuring her to quit as long as she can handle the annual emergency tests required by the Federal Aviation Administration. "I've been a little piece of Delta," Webb says modestly. "It's been my life."



With more seniority than any flight attendant in Delta history, she still logs up to 85 air-hours a month on international flights. In March, Webb flew from home base in Atlanta to Barcelona, Munich and Rio. "She does it because she likes it," says supervisor Jill Houk, 50, "There's an old graciousness about her." Adds Delta pilot David Hazen, 44: "She is amazing. I want her vitamins."

Over the years, the petite air hostess has honed her unflappable skills: to wake snoring passengers - "a little punch in the arm"; to get the smelly-footed to put on their shoes - "Sir, put on your shoes please." She has weathered an occasional pinch - "Please don't ever do that again" - with the same aplomb she displayed when a bolt of lightning sliced through the cabin. "I just smiled like it never happened," Webb says. "There's no need to be scared if you're not grounded."

Webb took to the skies in 1946 at 26 after a two-year stint as the American Red Cross program director in Bari, Italy. At first, she dismissed a friend's suggestion that she become a stewardess. "Mostly, they hired beauty queens and Maids of Cotton," she says. But she applied anyway and was hired. Moving from Houston to Memphis to become a flight attendant, she left behind a flock of suitors and fell in love with flying. "It was a wonderful job," says Webb. "It still is. Flying is the fast living of life."

It wasn't so fast back then. Flying in DC-3s, with cruising speeds of 170 mph, roaring engines and no pressurization, "was like being in a steam kettle," Webb recalls. Stewardesses, as they were called then - "I don't care what they call me, as long as I get my paycheck" - labored to make the (nearly all-male) passengers comfortable, talking, playing cards and sometimes dining with them on layovers. To Webb's dismay, such old-fashioned service has gone the way of the Sunday chicken potpies Delta used to serve. "Now, there's no time," she says of the laptop generation. "They're busy working or sleeping."

Webb, who at 40 was forced into a desk job for nine years by age restrictions - which have since been dropped, along with a ban on marriage - has seen her share of airborne celebrities: Elvis ("I had barely heard of him"), Dolly Parton ("We asked how she kept her figure") and Hugh Downs ("He sat up all night and talked to me"). But for her the true thrill of the job has been living out a childhood dream. The youngest of six children born to Houston produce broker George Webb and his wife, Nellie, "I'd sit on the front porch and watch the clouds go by and think, 'Wouldn't it be fun to travel and see other places?'" Webb recalls.

She credits an unmarried aunt, a schoolteacher with whom she was sent to live during the Depression, with providing her with a model of independence - and a passion for education. Webb, who worked as a state clerk and a lifeguard while at the University of Texas at Austin, began sending \$10 a month in 1946 to help fund scholarships at what is now Rhodes College in Memphis. A frugal woman with no children (at 60, she married a butcher, who died seven years later), she has since helped dozens of students. Recently, after learning her neighbor in La Grange, Texas, was struggling to put a daughter through nursing school, Webb put up \$3,000. "Money comes and goes," she says. "When you leave this earth, what are you going to say that you did?"

Webb - whose house in La Grange is filled with complimentary bottles of shampoo and decks of Delta playing cards - did think about retiring, once, when her husband, Stanley, was alive. But when he died in 1986 she decided it was best to keep flying. "I like seeing people happy," she says. "Besides, I don't feel any different from when I was 35."

Payment Deadline: Payment must be received by Thursday, September 20th, so the final count can be given to the facility. Your check will be your reservation, so mail it early!!

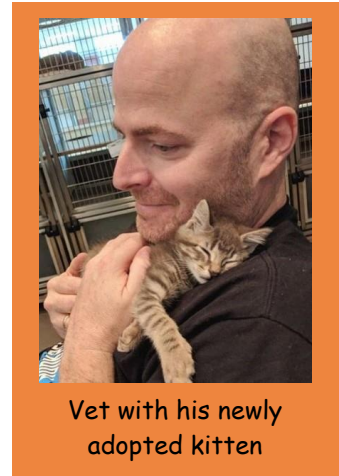

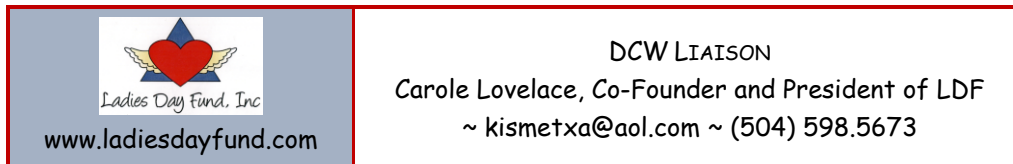

I hope everyone had a wonderful summer and are ready for the cooler fall weather. Ladies Day was thankful to receive the generous check of \$9,057.75 in July from the Delta Clipped Wings March fundraiser. We so appreciate the help received from DCW. This donation, along with, memberships and other donations from active flight attendants and retirees, has kept us going when we weren't able to have a New Orleans Ladies Day fundraiser.

Twenty years ago, there was no such organization as Ladies Day for flight attendants to receive financial assistance, so in 1998 our idea to help flight attendants in need came into existence. In 2004 I personally handed then Delta CEO Gerald Grinstein a 12-page booklet about the organization we started 6 years before. Three years later, prior to Mr. Grinstein retiring, he put in place the **Delta Care Fund** where all Delta employees/retirees may go for financial assistance. I have been told his creation of this fund was inspired by our Ladies Day organization!! Along with the Delta Care Fund and the **DALRC Retiree Assistance Program (RAP)**, employees and retirees currently have three places to go for help.

However, since Ladies Day has been struggling financially the last few years and, given the fact Delta's Care Fund and RAP are well-funded, my board of directors and I are wondering if there is still a need for us to exist. We will make that decision sometime before the end of this year. Nonetheless, whatever our decision will be, please know we appreciate and are so grateful for all the help we have received throughout the years by being one of DCW's charities!

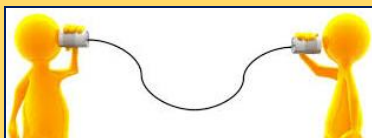

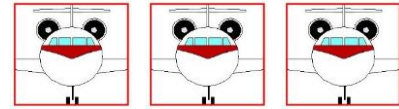

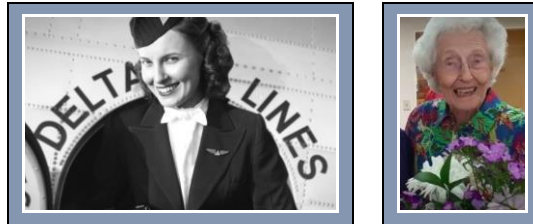

Original Delta Flight Attendant Turns 102: Happy Birthday to Sybil Peacock Harmon, a True Aviation Pioneer!

Sybil Peacock Harmon, who was a member of Delta Air Lines' first class of "stewardesses", will turn 102 on July 9. According to Delta's flight museum, Harmon was born in Minden, LA, on July 9, 1916. She served as a Delta stewardess from 1940-1943.

"Most of the customers we had in the beginning were businessmen and you got to know them real well because you would see them over and over," Harmon said, in a 2014 interview with Delta's flight museum. "But this was the beginning, really, of people flying. An emergency would come up ... people would get on a flight ... But this started people to flying because they realized how quick it was.

"It was quick for those days, anyway," said Harmon, who first served as an attendant on a Douglas DC-2.

Harmon entered military service in January 1944 at the Army Air Force regional hospital in Coral Gables, FL. She was a special duty nurse to U.S. Air Force Gen. Hap Arnold from January - April 1945.

Harmon was promoted to first lieutenant in April 1945 and joined the 830th Medical Air Evacuation Squadron in Stockton, CA. She was discharged May 1946 and then served as an obstetrical nurse and later a supervisor at Baylor University Hospital in Dallas, TX.

"One of our duties was to pass out the chewing gum because planes then weren't pressurized; it helped passengers swallow, so they would not have problems with their ears," Harmon said. "I never used my nursing skills on the flights (all Delta's first flight attendants were registered nurses), but many passengers suffered from airsickness from no air conditioning and pressurization. The airsickness container in those days was a quart ice cream container and it fit in a little round ring under the seat, so you wanted to get that out in plenty of time."

Harmon retired in 1985 after a career in private business.

"This was so new to people," Harmon said of commercial aviation's early years. "On Sundays they would come out to the airport and line the fence; whole families, and when you would walk up to the plane in your uniform, the kids would say, 'Look, there she is. There is the stewardess.' And you felt like a little celeb of some sort. It was a lot of fun."

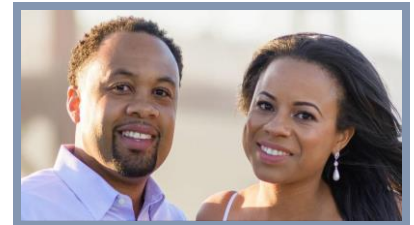

!!We still get a few BOUNCED EMAIL notices from a number of our members!! This means the email we sent could not be delivered to the recipient.

It used to be...

When you downloaded your emails onto your desktop computer (through programs like Outlook using a POP3 protocol) from your email server (e.g., Gmail, Bellsouth, etc.), the emails were automatically removed from the mail server. If you didn't download your emails very often, they "collected" on the server and reached a quota determined by your provider. An "over quota" message **would** appear and an email sent to you by someone would "bounce back" to the sender.

In recent years...

Mobile devices use a different protocol, called IMAP, to run email programs. IMAP simply "copies" your emails to your device/s. It leaves the original message on the server, but when a change is made on one device, a change is made on the others, keeping them all in sync. You can still download the original message onto your desktop/laptop and then go into the server and delete the original message. That frees up space on your server so you won't reach your quota.

So...

If you or a friend has mentioned they are not getting our emails, **BEFORE** you/they contact us to look for and fix a problem (**problems are usually from the member's end, not DCW**), try the following:

- OVER QUOTA:** You simply have too much "stuff" occupying your email space! Emails in your **Sent, Receive, Forward, Reply, Spam and Trash** folders take up a lot of space toward your quota!
 - DOWNLOAD important stuff to your computer OR flash drive.
 - DELETE what you don't need on your server.
 - EMPTY your trash after deleting items in all the above-mentioned folders.
- CHECK SPAM/JUNK FOLDERS:** Be sure to "accept" email from **dcw@memberclicks-mail.net**.
- CHECK BLOCKED SENDER LIST:** Be sure the DCW email address (dcw@memberclicks-mail.net) hasn't been accidentally added to this list.



??? Is it a "safe sender list" or a "white list" or a "filter list" ???
 We don't know what to tell you, soooooo...



The following article may help you figure out how to be sure you are receiving our emails. Providers use different names, so check your email provider's instructions.

Whitelist email addresses from specific senders to prevent communications ending up in your spam folder.

Ensure that emails from specific addresses reach your Inbox, and not your Junk or Spam folder, by adding them to a safe senders list, which is also called "whitelisting".

Your email provider or security service (if you use one) has their own instructions for adding email address to a whitelist. Find the instructions listed here or look up instructions with the provider or service you use. If you're instructing your contacts to add your email address to their safe sender lists, make sure they add the address you use in your "From" email address line.
