LOCATION: E Group Room on E Concourse located behind McDonald's.

DAY OF YOUR SHIFT: Once you have parked you will need to get your gate pass that will allow you access through the SECURITY CHECK POINT. All volunteers need to check-in at BANK 4 at Delta's main level ticket counter. The monitor above the position will be labeled GATE PASS CHECK-IN. Be sure to tell the Agent you are volunteering in the military lounge and need to pick up a gate pass. You will need to show a photo ID to get your pass and once again when you go through the check point. The Agents in the lobby have been briefed on these procedures; hopefully you won't have any problems, but if you do, please look for a Passenger Service Agent in their red coat.

PHOTO ID: The name you use to sign-up <u>must match</u> the ID you are going to show to get through Security. Children without a photo ID may be escorted through with an adult.

FOOD: The lounge welcomes ALL types of food, especially homemade, fresh food! You may take your food directly to the lounge provided it will be allowed through Security. If not, DELTA DASH is located right before you enter the lower level curbside area. Please note, all food items must be wrapped, dated and marked with the donor's information, i.e., name and address.

TOYS: The lounge will accept whatever one is willing to donate.

PARKING for retirees: 1) Park at the GO for free and ride the employee bus to the terminal. Note: To park at the GO you MUST HAVE your retiree badge with you. 2) Park at the airport. Note: As of this printing, Delta has not received confirmation from the city for parking passes, so check at the end of your shift to see if they are available.

Thank you in advance for helping to honor our Military during this holiday season. They have waited a long time to come home to their loved ones and this opportunity allows us to thank them for their sacrifices. The Closing of Ladies Day Fund, Inc.

In the summer of 1998, the first New Orleans Ladies Day Boat Party Fundraiser was put together in six weeks. Janice Martin, a former New Orleans-based flight attendant dealing with Stage 4 cancer, was the reason. Former flight attendants came from all over the country to support our friend; we raised \$5,000!! The party received rave reviews; many attendees said, "You need to do this again!"

The following year I asked a friend if she would help put together another fundraiser, but she wasn't interested and told me it would be impossible to raise that much money again -- it would flop!! I chose to forget the definition of impossible ...

For the next 19 years, there have been many exciting fundraisers! Support has come from co-workers all over the country. Countless numbers of our flight attendants (active and retired) have been assisted as they dealt with heavy financial burdens due to serious illness or unexpected life misfortune.

In 2005, our 8th fundraiser was scheduled for September 10th, but it never happened due to Hurricane Katrina that hit on August 29th. As you know, Katrina was one of the most destructive hurricanes in history and it dealt a tremendous blow to our city. With a broken city, some people thought it would possibly be the demise of Ladies Day; however, that wasn't the case. In 2006, we packed up and headed to Atlanta to hold our 8th fundraiser. We decorated the event in New Orleans "Mardi Gras-style" and DCW members went out of their way to help! For example, regardless of how busy Sandy Chinn was organizing the Clipped Wings Fundraiser that year, she was always available to help with any questions I had.

And what a special privilege it was in 2005 when LDF was selected as one of DCW's charities. Our special connection with DCW has been rich with the many wonderful friendships we have made, not to mention the great financial help LDF received!

Though it seems to be the right time, the decision to "close our doors" at the end of 2018 was not without mixed emotions. Endings are never easy ... and this one has been a very emotional, bittersweet and difficult decision! My board of directors and I felt, for many reasons, it was time. We will always look back at what an incredible journey it's been ... so exciting and rewarding!!

If you can, imagine someone who is hurting and trying to cope and probably overwhelmed and then they find a letter in their mailbox with a check from Ladies Day Fund ... how special is that?

Because of you, our caring and supportive flight attendant brothers and sisters, those wonderful gift checks were made possible. Many, many people's day improved after opening those letters! To everyone who has believed in our mission and helped support it in their own special way, e.g., making donations, paying membership dues, participating in our fundraisers, etc., THANK YOU, THANK YOU, THANK YOU SO VERY MUCH!!

This year we achieved 100 percent pay parity, something few companies have done. We'll need to keep working hard to build a workplace that's equitable in all areas, and this recognition reflects the progress we're making in this area."

To determine the BEST WORKPLACES FOR WOMEN, Great Place to Work analyzed anonymous survey feedback representing more than 4.5 million U.S. employees. Most of the ranking is based on what women themselves report in a 60-question "Trust Index" survey about their workplace, and how fairly those experiences compare to men's reports of the same workplaces. Fifteen percent of the remaining rank is based on how well represented women are in the workforce and throughout management, considering industry trends.

"This year, we pledged to close the employee experience gender gap by 2020, and these winning organizations are leading the way in achieving this mission, proving that all companies, regardless of their industry, size or complexity, can be great workplaces for women," said Michael Bush, CEO of Great Place to Work. "Empowering women in the workplace isn't just the right thing to do - it's a business imperative. Organizations can create their own equitable cultures by learning from the companies on this list, who get women's buy-in of the mission and inspire them to innovate, driving the entire company forward."

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
