

The Atlanta Humane Society has been able to safely reopen their West Midtown facility with no appointment required for adopters. We are limiting the number of people permitted in the building at one time, requiring masks and social distancing, and have implemented a virtual waitlist for adopters who want to visit with the animals. We continue to do virtual adoptions for those animals in foster care and are hosting adoption pop-up events at our Alpharetta location on select days. We hope to be back in both our Alpharetta and Duluth locations on a regular basis in 2021.

This month animals like Little Girl and Ace have found homes at our Howell Mill location through our American Heroes Adoption Program this month.

Imani came in with her heart set on a particular puppy we had, but it was in foster with another family. She decided to look around our dog area and spotted Little Girl and fell in love. Once they met, Little Girl was all over Imani; she knew she had found the right puppy. We completed her adoption thoroughly because, like most, she was a first-time dog owner as an adult and a veteran who has PTSD. Our Adoption Manager had an amazing conversation with Imani and once the counseling was done, she brought Little Girl out and the puppy ran right up to Imani as if she was saying, "I'm ready, mom. Let's go!"





Ace was adopted by this American Hero, Tyris, who recently retired from the military. Now that he had a lot of free time on his hands, he was ready for a puppy. He came in and immediately fell in love with Ace. He was super excited to train him and get to know his bubbly puppy personality.

A Message from Delta Care and Scholarship Funds, Inc. The Delta Scholarship Fund Application window is open!

NEW THIS YEAR, there will be fifty (50) certificate scholarships, worth \$1,000 each, dedicated just for retirees. The application window is open now through January 31, 2021. The Fund will be awarding scholarship awards equaling \$1.85M for the 2021-2022 school year.

Efforts are underway to make changes to the "**Deltanet for alumni**" so accessing the scholarship application process is more intuitive. Until those changes are made you should use the following steps:

- 1. Go to the "Deltanet for alumni" home page.
- 2. Enter "scholarship" in the search window.
- 3. Click on the link "Delta Scholarship Fund."
- 4. Once you are on the Fund page, scroll down to "Application Info" and click on "Submit Scholarship Application."
 - This action opens the "Account Login" page to the ISTS* application window.
 - Click on the "Don't have an account? Register!" line.
 - Register to the ISTS application by completing "Create An Account."
- 5. Click "REGISTER."
 - This will open the Delta Scholarship "Welcome" page with the application questionnaire.
 - Complete the questionnaire and click the "SUBMIT" button.

* ISTS - International Scholarship & Tuition Services: ISTS is the third-party vendor contracted with the Delta Care and Scholarship Funds, Inc. for scholarship program administration. Using ISTS ensures the selection process is unbiased and fair to all applicants. Applicants will receive an email confirmation from ISTS once you have registered. NOTE: The Delta Scholarship Fund and Delta Care Fund are fueled by Delta employee and retiree donations.
